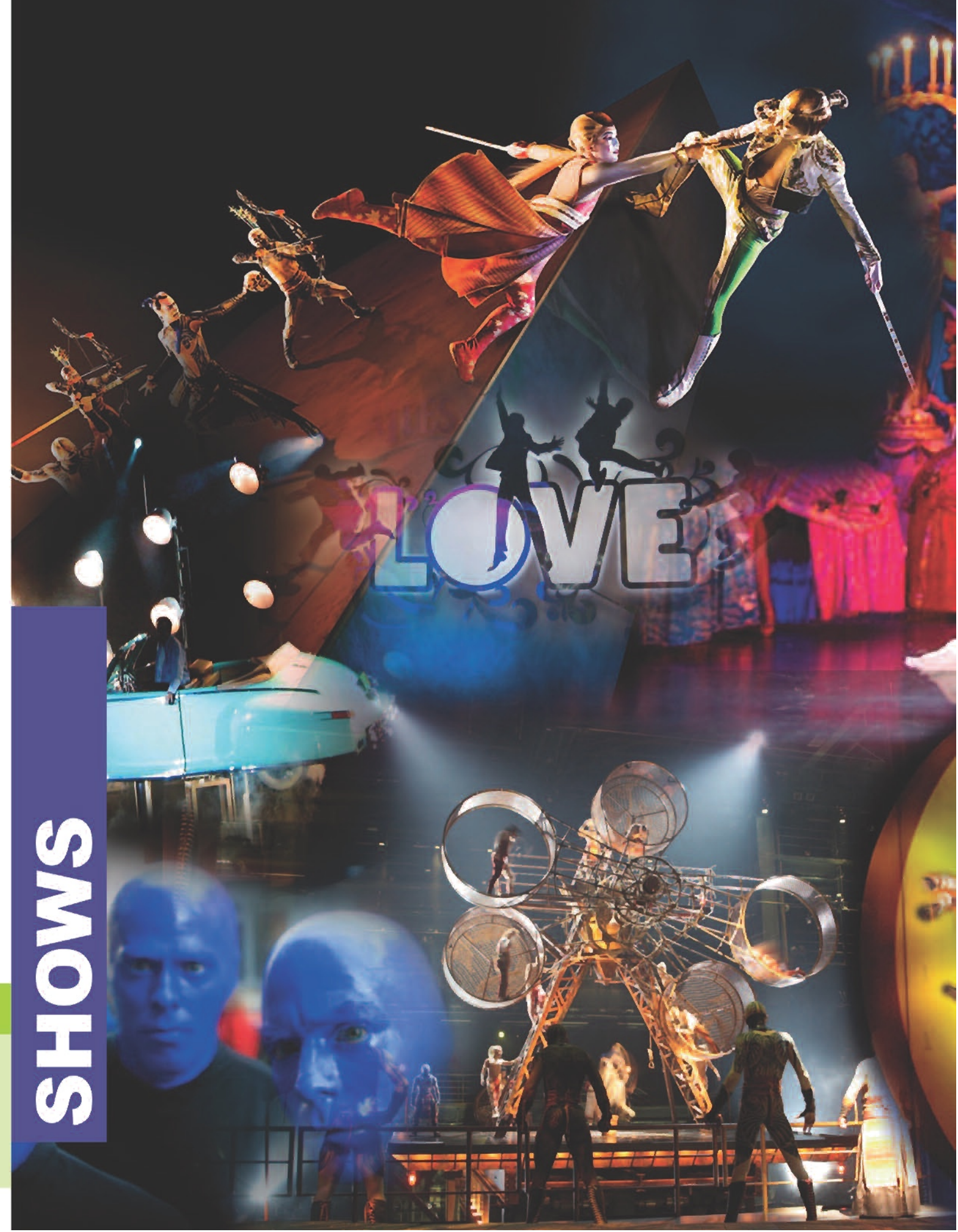

If you're like many Las Vegas transplants, you thought about throwing away all the long pants and sweaters, parkas and mukluks before moving here. But, if you're lucky, you couldn't make yourself do it - you saved some winter clothes for those return visits "home." That absolutely does make you lucky because, believe it or not, it gets cold here in the winter. It may take you a year or two to acclimate, but soon enough you too will be complaining about the 30 degree temperatures while remaining mindless of the fact that back home it could approach 0 degrees on cold winter nights. You will need the warm pants and sweater, and maybe even the ski pants and boots. You may be sitting outside on a lawn chair watching your kid's sports games, wearing your winter coat, hat, scarf, gloves, and wrapped in a blanket as shelter against the northern winter winds.

Now, some nearby winter activities don't require warm clothes. A road trip to the beaches of Los Angeles or San Diego comes immediately to mind. To some, this is the ultimate winter activity. Traveling south to Phoenix works for a weekend getaway as well. Temperatures in Phoenix are generally ten degrees warmer than Las Vegas, which is why it's one of the snowbird capitals of the world. Vegas, not so much. Shorts and bathing suits, anyone?

Las Vegas is perfectly located to visit many different terrains and climates in a weekend or even a single day. From water to desert to mountains, take your pick on any day off. You can do snow in the morning, a sunny lake in the afternoon, and desert neon at night. Who's got it better?

Less than an hour northwest of Las Vegas is Mount Charleston, originally named Charleston Peak by famous frontier explorer John C. Fremont for Charleston, South

Carolina, his wife's hometown.

Yet, even with the rich and romantic history, the peak is still fondly referred to as Mount Charleston by locals. There are many options for playing in the snow on the slopes of the mountain, including sledding, skiing, winter picnics, horseback riding, and building a snowman. The Las Vegas Ski and Snowboard Resort is located at the end of Lee Canyon on the north side of the peak. With thirteen runs and an average of 120 inches of snow yearly, it's the closest place to get your boarding fix. There are two places to overnight on Mount Charleston (unless you're one of the lucky ones with a cabin on the mountain): Mount Charleston Hotel and Restaurant, located about ¾ of the way up, and Mount Charleston Lodge, located at the end of the Kyle Canyon road on the south side of the mountain. Dress warmly and have snow tires or chains on your car for the trip. Also, be sure to start your trip with a full tank of gas as there are no facilities on the mountain.

Travel about two hours north on the I-15 and you will discover St. George, Utah. Besides the fun the town has to offer, such as Snow Canyon, outlet shopping, and some great golfing, there is Dixie National Forest about twenty minutes out of town. Perfect for a winter trip, the forest is the ultimate locale to enjoy the beauty and scent of fresh snow on the pines. There are plenty of minimally-traveled roads to pull over on and play in the snow. During the holidays, after purchasing a \$15 permit, you can even hunt for and cut down your own fresh Christmas tree. What a wonderful family tradition.

Further north on Interstate 15, about two and a half to three hours ahead and up the mountain through the town of Parowan, Utah is Brianhead Ski and Snowboard Resort. The first ski area in Utah to open this winter, the wonderful little winter oasis offers two completely different ski hills that provide a total of 65 runs on 650 acres of snow-covered terrain. Reasonably priced and rarely crowded, it's the gem of Utah for winter activities like tubing, snowshoeing, and snowmobiling, as well as skiing. Again, make sure you have snow tires and/or chains on your ve-

hicle; surprise snowstorms are not uncommon. There are numerous lodging opportunities on the mountain, in the town of Parowan, or in Cedar City, about 30 minutes away.

Closer to home, hiking is still possible

in winter in Red Rock Canyon and Valley of Fire, both about 45 minutes out of town. Rangers advise dressing warmly, in layers, and still packing plenty of water, regardless of the cooler temperatures. The average high temperature in Red Rock is

57 degrees during the day, 33 degrees at night in December and January. Also remember, it gets dark much earlier so get an early start and bring along a flashlight for emergencies. Lee Kirk, outdoor recreation planner for Red Rock Canyon, says, "Some people really like hiking in the cold; the pleasure one gets out of it depends on your temperature requirements. There may be snow on some of the trails, especially in Red Rock, where the elevation is substantially higher than Las Vegas. Some may even be

closed on actual snow days. As with any hiking trip, be sure someone knows where you're going and when you will return." Valley of Fire rarely gets snow, but the cold temperatures can still be a factor. Use the same precautions.

As you can see, Vegas is perfectly located for many types of activities. You can ski the mountain or boat the lake in the morning, come home and sit in your hot tub sipping wine in the afternoon. And that's what life's all about.

Economic Waste in Recession-Impacted Nevada?

During the 1920s, Frank Detra moved to Las Vegas from Reno by way of Chicago and opened what is considered to be one of, if not the first, gaming casino on Highway 91, better known today as the Las Vegas Strip. His casino, the Pair-O-Dice, no longer stands, nor do the properties that followed: The Ambassador Nightclub, the Hotel Last Frontier, and the famous New Frontier. These properties were built on the bankroll of organized crime, and now former mob attorney and current Las Vegas Mayor Oscar Goodman wants to celebrate the rich history of organized crime and the law enforcement that contended to shut down mob control of Sin City through a city-funded tourist attraction known as the Las Vegas Museum of Organized Crime and Law Enforcement, affectionately coined the "Mob Museum"

Organized Crime in Las Vegas

Along with Detra, Benjamin "Bugsy" Siegel came to Las Vegas with mob money in his pocket and dollar signs in his eyes. Siegel oversaw the construction and eventual operation of the Flamingo Hotel and Casino in 1946. Unfortunately for Bugsy, the men holding the purse strings, Meyer Lansky and his mob associates, were not impressed with how poorly Siegel was running their new multi-million dollar investment. Siegel met a brutal fate in Hollywood, with five bullets to the head, and three of Lansky's associates arrived in Vegas and took over immediate operation of the Flamingo.

During the 1950s and 60s almost every business venture that involved gaming and resort operations had Lansky's fingerprints clearly on it. The Siegel



snuff out and the subsequent takeover by business-minded mobsters provided the organized criminals with a high profit margin that lasted for years.

Many years later, a man named Allen Glick formed a corporation funded by teamsters' pension funds and purchased the now-defunct Stardust and Fremont resort casinos. Glick worked hand in hand with mob handicapper extraordinaire Lefty Rosenthals, who managed the properties as hotels under the guise of not being able to acquire the proper gaming licenses needed for gambling due to his previous criminal behavior. By the early 1980s, numerous officials and organized crime figures with ties to both Rosenthals and Glick had their state gaming licenses revoked, thus handcuffing the control that organized crime had over these properties. It was a sign of things to come.

Many locals, along with a majority of Mob historians, believe the end of organized crime in Las Vegas came by way of the Hole in the Wall gang, led by the late Tony "the Ant" Spilotro. Having wreaked havoc on the streets of Las Vegas through brutal, violent attacks and countless burglaries throughout the city, Spilotro opened the eyes of federal law enforcement as well as his crime bosses back in Chicago. Numerous arrests, indictments, and would be convictions sent Spilotro's gang either to prison or into hiding, and when Spilotro and his brother Michael returned to Chicago to handle business with their bosses they were found almost two weeks later—both beaten to death in an Indiana cornfield. As the old saying goes,

"Loose lips sink ships."

With Spilotro's murder and Rosenthal's mischief within the casino industry shining light on the situation, Nevada Gaming officials as well as Federal Law Enforcement decided to make it their collective goal to put the control of Las Vegas' casinos and resorts into the ownership hands of corporate businesses, headed by men such as Steve Wynn. As those convictions and murders came down, so did the grip of power that organized crime had on Las Vegas.

Financing the Celebration of Crime?

Mayor Oscar Goodman's original goal was to acquire federal stimulus money for the "construction-ready" project, stating that jobs for the construction workforce would be plentiful, and that the thousands of visitors to the museum each year would help to stimulate the sagging Las Vegas economy. Opposition by way of Senator Mitch McConnell believes that federal funds via the stimulus package have absolutely no business being used for a mob museum. Said McConnell: "we would like, on the spending side, obviously, to avoid funding things like a mob museum or water slides."

Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid commented on the issue, stating "there will be no earmarks in the stimulus package." Congresswoman Dina Titus believes that any stimulus cash that Nevada receives would be put to better use by improving the transportation infrastructure.

"You've got to be careful," she said. "The public's not going to put up with things."

So where does that leave the Las Vegas Organized Crime and Law Enforcement Museum? Who or what is flipping the bill on the estimated \$50 million dollar construction tab, which will be located at an old U.S. Post Office

building and courthouse? The Nevada Commission for Cultural Affairs approved an additional \$83,000 this past November to go along with the \$330,000 approved the month before to continue what is being called "retrofit" construction. The funding breakdown appears to look like this: \$7 million in government grants, \$8 million in city funds, and the remaining \$35 million from Las Vegas' redevelopment group.

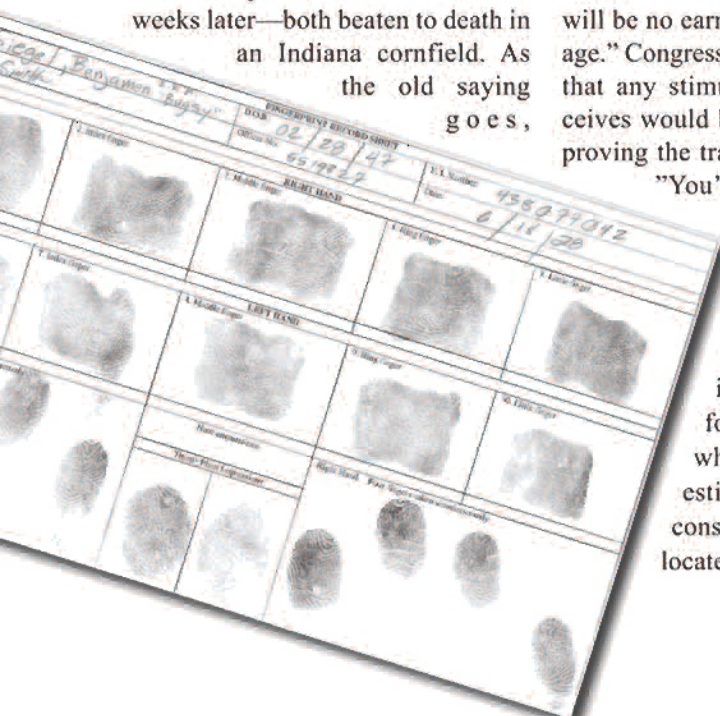
When asking citizens of Sin City whether they think Mayor Goodman's plans will work, it is a mixed bag response at best. Many Las Vegas feel that with an ever-increasing jobless rate, a massive housing crisis and a lack of funding for the fifth-largest school district in the country, there are many more pressing issues to be discussed.

Supporters such as Mayor Goodman believe that the museum will draw somewhere in the vicinity of 250,000 visitors per year, thus injecting much needed funds back into the Las Vegas tourism economy. Mob enthusiasts will be able to wire tap one another, have their very own mug shot taken, and there is even a room dedicated to organized crime's influence on pop culture scheduled to be included in the museum's exhibits. The museum has the backing of the FBI and supports the history of both organized crime, law enforcement's role in ending mob control in Las Vegas and the various stages of development and evolution the city has taken on since the 1920s.

Love the idea or despise it, the museum will be opening. Mayor Goodman, whose term is set to end in 2011, has this one last project to oversee, a project and a history that he directly was involved in and feels a personal attachment to. Whether his vision for the museum and its impact on the economy of Las Vegas is correct, only the ghosts of Vegas' past and the tourists of Vegas know for sure.

Hotel Room Training

I found myself in a complete power outage when preparing for a physique competition. Rather than panic, I used my dismal situation to devise a brand new way to exercise. I would like to take a few minutes to share my experience with you.

While preparing for the Canadian Bodybuilding Federation Championships in 2003, I found myself in the middle of the largest blackout in Canadian and American history. Caused by a massive power fluctuation due to unusually high temperatures in the Northeast, over 55 million people, me included, were left without power. This meant no gym, no healthy, home-cooked meals, and no public transportation available to get anywhere. I was stuck.

It was August of 2003, just a few weeks from my figure show. I was in shock when I heard that I would be stuck in a hotel, stranded in Toronto, Ontario between flights as I traveled from Nassau, Bahamas to Victoria, BC Canada. My new home was actually in Mississauga, and to create a workout, I relied on the only power around: my will power.

The result of dedicating just 20 minutes a day to fitness while you are on the road can make a difference in your vacation. You will feel more alert with an increase in energy. Your level of guilt when you enjoy dessert at the buffet will barely be noticed.

Looking back at that show in 2003 I know that every piece of dedication paid off. I have since then placed 1st at the Canadian Fitness & Figure Nationals, and just recently 2nd place at Fitness America in Las Vegas. Whether you are working out for general health and fitness or a competitive athlete, it's important to take time for you. I am sure you know the saying, "I don't have time to work out." You must make time! Schedule your work-

outs into your calendar and honor each fitness appointment. Setting aside 20 – 60 minutes a day for fitness will help you reduce a variety of life's stresses, including food cravings and anxiety. Use my basic hotel room workout above and feel the immediate difference.

Here are the essential basics for you to use when it comes to staying fit anywhere, and at anytime!

Skipping or jogging on the spot for 2 – 3 minutes for getting your heart rate up. Be sure to always have a skipping rope in your suitcase. Jump rope is an excellent alternative to jogging outside or using a treadmill, plus you can stay in the comfort of your hotel room.

Pushups for your chest and front delts. Great for getting your heart rate up.

Squats for your glutes, quads and hamstrings. Also raises your heart rate fast.

Dips from a chair with feet on the floor. Works your triceps.

Crunches (reverse, side and regular), working your abs.

Lunges for your glutes, quads and hamstrings, and maintaining an elevated heart rate.

Repeat circuit at least two to four times for a total of three to five complete circuits.

After much anticipation and speculation, CityCenter finally opened its doors on December 16th. In CityCenter, MGM Mirage CEO Jim Murren, envisioned a world-class cultural arts and architecture destination. So now that's it's open, what can you expect from CityCenter. Is it really the game changer that the Bellagio was to Las Vegas when it opened in 1998? Can we as locals afford to go to CityCenter? Will it cause MGM Mirage to go bankrupt and will it put the nail in the coffin for Las Vegas hotel rates? No matter what your opinion about CityCenter is here is our locals guide to CityCenter.

Aria Resort & Casino

The 4004 room center piece of CityCenter is the home to 16 world class restaurants, including restaurants by Shawn McClain, Michael Mina, Jean Georges, Julian Serrano, and three-star Michelin chef Masayoshi Takayama is another chef making his Vegas debut with Bar Masa for modern Japanese dining and Shaboo, which features a style of Japanese hot-pot cooking called shabu with a \$500 per person fixed-price menu, so be sure to bring your black card with you.

For more cost effective options we recommend Michael Mina's American Fish which showcases seafood from the nation's great lakes, rivers and oceans. The smell from the wood-burning oven, one of the five techniques Mina uses to cook your meal, fills American Fish, complementing the restaurant's earthy décor.

Also on our staffs recommended dining list is Sage by Shawn

McClain. Sage features a "new American" menu, with a bit of a Mediterranean flair. The interior of Sage is dramatic, decorated in dark purple hues and dim lighting, accented with hanging chandeliers and floor-to-ceiling murals.

With over 10 bars and lounges you have plenty of places to relax and enjoy a cocktail. For a fun entertaining option we recommend Bar Moderno, located just off the main casino floor next to the resort elevators, features nightly entertainment at the bars hand crafted purple piano.

Aria houses the 140,000 sq ft casino which offers all of the games that we have come to love and contrary to a lot of people's opinions the limits are very reasonable for a high end property.

Technology is at the heart of CityCenter and Aria use Control4 automation system monitors energy usage. The system provides a level of personalization second to none in Las Vegas. The Control4 system remembers guests' preferences. When guests swipe their room card, it restores their preferences for temperature, lights, window coverings and greets the guest by name.

Mandarin Oriental

The world renowned Mandarin Oriental makes its debut at CityCenter. The Mandarin Oriental features 392 guest rooms and suites along with 225 residences. One of the best features is the SkyLobby located on the 23rd floor, guests are greeted by expansive

views of the Vegas skyline.

Our staff recommends the Mandarin Bar with some of the best views of the strip in all of Las Vegas. For the who want to impress the Mandarin is the place to go.

The Mandarin Oriental features Twist by Pierre Gagnaire is the only restaurant in the US where you can experience the extraordinary cuisine of three-star Michelin chef. For those very special events we recommend reserving the private dining room. The private room features seating for up to 12 and staff dedicated to your every concern.

Crystals

Crystals is an experiential environment combining dramatic architecture and design with the world's most elite high-end couture and luxury brands such as Louis Vuitton, Tiffany & Co., Bulgari, Ermenegildo Zegna, H. Stern, Marni and Mikimoto.

Crystals features restaurants' from the likes of Wolfgang Puck, Todd English. Personally I can't wait for the Mastro's Ocean Club to open on February 5th. Mastro's is legendary for serving up the freshest seafood and legendary USDA prime steaks served on a 400 degree steak plate.

As you walk through the mall, it almost feels like you're outdoors. You'll come across a real aloe tree, a colorful, living flower "carpet," and even a tree house-looking fixture where people can sit and enjoy a meal.

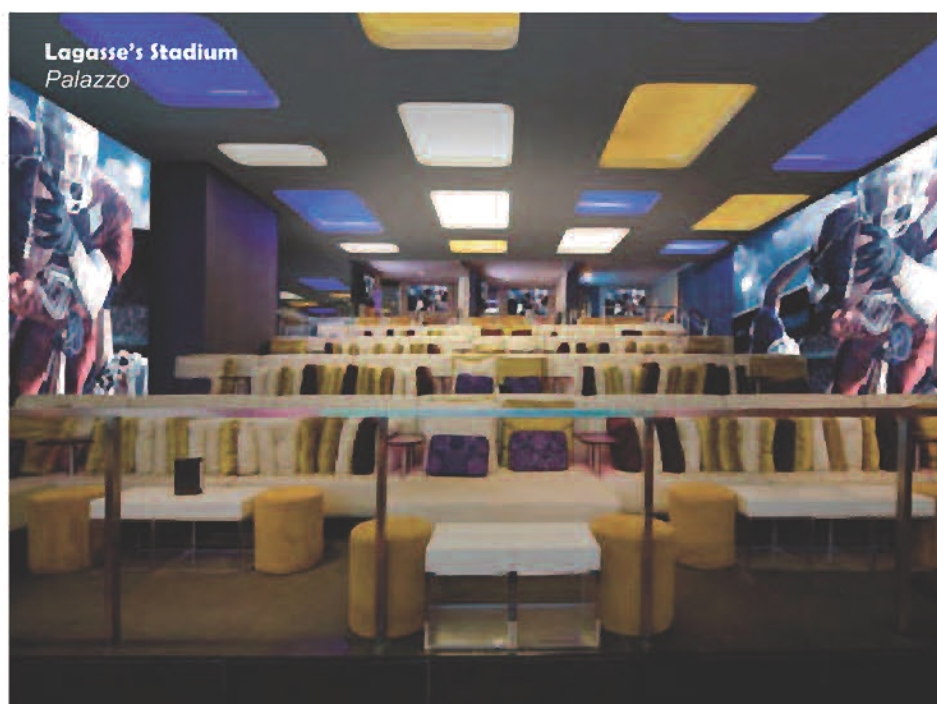

Tasty Menu is Anything but the Blues

On Saturday winter nights the air is cool outside, but upon entering B.B. King's Blues Club and hearing the immortal blues played live one can immediately feel the warmth emanating from the newest spot for music enthusiasts located inside the Mirage Hotel and Casino. B.B. King, the undisputed master of the blues, has brought the pulse of the blues to the soul and now brings delicious sensations to the palette. Real comfort food from the South.

music wafting through the air; a laid-back, "just enjoy yourself" atmosphere permeates the establishment.

We were afforded an exclusive, invite-only look into B.B. King's Blues Club for the pre-opening party. The night we spent there was an experience second to none.

Chris Cain, a fantastic blues musician who for many years has played at numerous blues festivals around the world, was performing as the opening act and his bluesy tunes were sensational. He opened with "I Feel So Good" and carried the musical sentiments onto everyone in the house. The mellow sounds of the guitar and the scent of real southern food merged together perfectly to form an unbelievably satisfying auditory and gustatory combination that is unmatched by any other musical venue in Las Vegas.

Later that evening B.B. King's All-Star House Band came on stage and rocked the house. On the dance floor were two gentlemen from the audience who spontaneously got up and began rolling with the sounds, each outdoing the other with their fancy footwork and taking turns in an almost competitive impromptu performance that was a true sight to behold in this town of ultra lounges and plastic environments.

The food is perhaps the best Creole cui-

sine this side of the Louisiana border. Chef Oscar Pena has created many delightful Southern dishes - try the fried green tomatoes or the deep-fried dill pickle chips with horseradish sauce. The gumbo ya ya is so delectable it seems to have been freshly made in the Bayou. The Southern fried catfish is mouth-watering and is accompanied by a Cajun staple: onion hush puppies. The number one item on the menu is the succulent BBQ ribs. Bet you can't eat just one rack! If you want a great dessert just ask for the banana bread pudding, baked to order and dripping with a creamy caramel sauce. When trying to choose a beverage, order the Boll Weevil, a signature cocktail made from Grey Goose vodka (Lucille's favorite; not Mr. King's guitar, but the female half of our Valley News Team), Patrón Reposado, Patrón Citronge, Tanqueray gin, and Don Q rum with a squirt of Sprite, a splash of grenadine and bit of pineapple juice. One or two of these should be more than enough to keep the blues at bay. There's also the Rock Me Baby and the Hoochie Coochie cocktail to tantalize your tongue and lift your spirits.

The number one thing that B.B. King accomplished when he created his restaurant in Las Vegas was the development of a high-quality menu with surprisingly affordable prices. You do not have to be a high roller with deep pockets to roll and rock at B.B. King's. There are fine fare options, of course, but spending hundreds of dollars is not necessary to fully enjoy your dining and musical experience. After

you eat, get yourself on that dance floor and let the music take control as you shake and shimmy to the beat.

Arguably the most impressive aspect of B.B. King's bluesy Mecca is the blues master's desire to keep his club from becoming a hotspot frequented solely by the evening crowd. To ensure this, he keeps the place open seven days a week from 6:30 a.m. to 2:00 a.m., Monday through Thursday, and from 6:30 a.m. to 4:00 a.m., Friday through Sunday. The friendly staff at B.B. King's Blues Club will serve you for breakfast, lunch, dinner or even a late-night snack.

The man behind the infamous Lucille is always reinventing himself, starting as the original Beale Street Blues Boy, transitioning into his days as Blues Boy King and finally to the inimitable B.B. King. Still wailing out the somber notes for which he is heralded, he now has expanded his ventures into a great, solid restaurant. He opened his original club on Beale Street in Tennessee, the home of the blues, in 1991 and later expanded to Nashville, New York, Orlando and West Palm Beach. The Las Vegas Strip is the site of his newest venue and one can easily predict a long and storied Las Vegas history for Mr. King's jazzy junction.

Taking the Country by Storm

Off to their best start since their National Championship Season, the UNLV Runnin' Rebels Men's Basketball Team Looks to Dominate the Mountain West Conference as the calendar turns to 2010

A stunning victory over a ranked, well-respected opponent in Louisville, a hard-fought overtime victory against perennial PAC-10 powerhouse Arizona and their best start since their only NCAA National Championship in Men's Basketball... The UNLV Runnin' Rebels have plenty to be excited about and thankful for as the calendar turns from 2009 to the dawn of a new decade.

The Rebels are headed to Honolulu in sunny Hawaii to compete in the Diamond Head Classic, with a guaranteed 1st round match-up against Southern

Methodist University. If the Rebels win, they can play up to two more games before returning home. Lose, and you come home and prepare for Mountain West Conference play, which begins January 6th in Provo, Utah against bitter conference rival Brigham Young University.

Since beginning the season back in November, the Rebels have garnered something not ever easily handed out—national respect and a ranking, reaching as high as 15th in the AP polls and 17th, according to the coaches. Of course, this is all before getting whipped by head coach Lon Kruger's alma matter, Kansas State, at the Orleans Arena. Since then their three victories in a row have gotten

the Rebels ranked again, standing solid at 23rd and sure to move up as other top-ranked teams in front of them continue to stumble as they have over the last several days.

So what lies ahead for the Rebels? Four of their first six conference games are on the road; the opener is against a tough BYU squad and the Rebels then play a marquee match-up in "The Pit" in Albuquerque, taking on Indiana Hoosier legend Steve Alford's top-20 ranked New Mexico. Tough road games in Laramie against Wyoming and home court rematches against BYU, New Mexico, and one final road test in Salt Lake City against Utah during the month of February should form the backbone of what is already becoming a very nice resume for the NCAA Tournament selection committee.

Head Coach Lon Kruger has two Mountain West Conference Tournament titles under his belt, multiple 20-win seasons while at UNLV, and two impressive NCAA Tourney runs over the last couple of years. This season, the group, led by Bob Cousy Award Nominee Derrick Jasper, could provide the city of Las Vegas with more fireworks with a dominant conference regular season performance as a preview of things to come in the Conference Tournament and the NCAA Tournament.

The 2008-09 version of the Rebels left a bad taste in the community's mouth, with inconsistent play, and bearing witness to losses previously thought unimaginable at the beginning of last season. That was last season. This is a new group, reinvigorated and more mature. A more experienced group.

Thus far, the 2009-2010 UNLV Runnin' Rebels have gone back to basics, returning to Lon Kruger trademark basketball—suffocating and stifling defense, and the inner fire to dive after every loose ball, to contest every single shot, and to play selfless, fast-paced team basketball. It has worked to the tune of ten wins against only one loss so far - can the magic of a special season continue into Mountain West Conference play in 2010 and perhaps an NCAA Tournament berth? Stay tuned Rebel Nation!
