Welcome to the Wonderful World of Las Vegas! Have a Night on the Town Without Breaking the Bank By Aeza Menor

ot everybody can be a Vegas highroller and casino moguls are well aware of this - for this reason, many of the premier properties all across town offer endless ways to take advantage of their many fabulous amenities.

Partying like a weekend jetsetter doesn't have to cost you an entire month's salary.

If the itch to gamble like a celebrity with cards in your hand seems to strike you frequently, table games for as low as \$1 per hand can be found at Ellis Island. If you like the atmosphere of downtown Las Vegas, table games there can be had for as low as \$3. Drinks are free for players. There are even poker games that you can buy into at the MGM and many other properties on the strip, playing \$1 and \$2 No Limit with a \$40-\$200 cap. If you're not a poker player but have always wanted to learn, call your favorite casino and ask for their free table game seminars. They all have them, all are free, and the money is funny, but you can have a great time on someone else's dime.

Be "in the know" and sign up for a player's card. These reward cards give you steady perks for your time at the tables or machines, so while you're playing and having fun you're also earning a free dinner or souvenir for later. Great places to go and get these deals are the Wynn, Venetian, Bellagio and MGM properties, Caesars and Harrah's properties, and all the Station casinos. With your player's card you receive on average \$1 per hour of play at the poker tables and

machines or, depending on how much you risk, comped meals, merchandise, or even rooms.

It's definitely worthwhile to sign up for rewards if you want to enhance your good time gambling, dining, seeing shows, getting nice hotel rooms, or enjoying the various pools and amenities.

The aforementioned Ellis Island Casino & Brewery lies behind Bally's and is one of the most popular local joints in town. They have very affordable drinks, live karaoke and inexpensive food at the cafe. Many locals consider it one of the best kept secrets of Vegas, not too flashy, and a great place to spend a night with close friends.

If dancing is more your style you can always find live music at the Cleopatra Lounge in Caesars Palace. The lounge at Bill's Gamblin' Hall & Saloon also provides weekend tunes and there's always the house band at Margaritaville next to The Flamingo.

Whenever you're on the strip or in a casino, you can count on running into plenty of nightclub workers whose job it is to hand out discount flyers or even free passes for the numerous clubs around town. If you grab a couple of these passes and show up early to the club (early meaning around 9 or 10pm), free or discounted entry for you and your entourage is a virtual guarantee.

If you can't afford a table you can always drink at the bar and still have a good time or even club-hop.

An even better deal for Vegas residents is on Sunday, Monday or Tuesday nights, also known as Industry Night. These nights are tailored exclusively for locals and typically include free local entry and two-for-one discounted bottle service. Many times, if you're in a group of five girls or more, the bottle will be provided free of charge. This is a win-win for both you and the club - after all, where the ladies go, the guys do follow!

Clubs that typically support Industry Night are Tao at The Venetian, Wynn's Tryst, XS at Encore, Jet at The Mirage, Drais at Bill's Gamblin' Hall & Saloon, Lavo at The Palazzo, Cathouse and LAX at The Luxor, Christian Audigier at T.I., Pure at Caesars Palace, and various other bars, clubs and lounges.

If you are curious whether your favorite in Wonderland. spot on the strip hosts Industry Nights, just give them a call.

If you happen to be one of the countless after hours employees whose shifts don't end until the wee hours of the morning, don't worry. Vegas has many late night clubs designed just for you and your friends. Places such as Drais at Bill's Gamblin' Hall & Saloon, Penthouse Club, Krave outside Planet Hollywood, and many gentlemen's clubs around town keep the party going until well after the sun

Vegas hookah lounges are a must for anyone searching for a unique and profoundly relaxing way to spend an evening.

The Mirage

This old-school Vegas property is home to Love, a phenomenal Cirque du Soleil production featuring the music of the Beatles. The Liverpool lads are also the inspiration for the theme of The Mirage's most popular spot, Revolution Lounge, which features gogo dancers and a house DJ on the weekends.

The club scene can be found at Jet - come to Industry Night on Mondays or show up on the weekend and watch the resident DJ keep the crowd moving with both house and mainstream tracks.

For a romantic meal during your night on the own, try Japonais or Samba Brazilian Steakhouse. To satisfy late-night munchies, hit up Cravings, BLT Burger or California Pizza Kitchen.

Paris Las Vegas

This haven of French culture naturally offers one op-tier restaurant experience after another. If spectacular dining is your forté, don't miss the Eiffel Tower Restaurant, where the incredible views are only eclipsed by the exquisite cuisine. Downstairs, they have the French restaurant Mon Amie Gabi, a much more casual eatery with outside seating, a fantastic lunch menu and a first rate view of the breathaking Fountains of Bellagio.

Mandalay Bay

Inside the Mandalay Bay there is the Foundation Room, an incredibly mellow lounge with a great atmosphere, due largely to the fact that it is located on the top floor of the property. The lounge splits its time as a restaurant in the evening and a club during the late hours and has what many consider the best view of the entire Las Vegas Strip.

On the ground floor is the ever-popular House of Blues, which plays home and host to a first class restaurant and countless bands and entertainers.

The Mandalay Bay is also known for its immaculate pool, containing a waterslide, a wave pool, and a surfing pool. Needless to say, the kids love it.

Hard Rock



L.E.E.D.er of the Pack

Energy Conservation in the Las Vegas Valley

ith global warming on the forefront of the state of affairs in the world, it is no small wonder the study and practice of design has become more sustainability-oriented, especially in the architectural and industrial design industries.

The west coast has been the leader in the green design movement with architects focusing on designing buildings integrated with the environment. According to the U.S. Green Building Council, buildings represent 38.9% of US primary energy use and 70% of the total electrical consumption and are one of the heaviest consumers of natural resources, accounting for a significant portion of the greenhouse gas emissions effecting climate change.

generates its own, consumes less water or directly. Considered by some as one of the

harvests it, uses more renewable and local resources to minimize transportation, and seeks to improve the external as well as internal environment. These factors serve to increase productivity and the overall well-being of the occupants.

Surprisingly, recent polls show more than 50% of the US population is still refusing to accept that our emissions are changing the climate and see it as a technical issue to be settled at some far off time in the future; certainly not within the current generations' lifetimes. Industry experts assert and predict otherwise.

Las Vegas in particular, being located in the hot and arid Mojave Desert, comes with specific environmental challenges, such as water and energy shortages, and A green building uses less energy or has felt the changes in the climate more

more unsustainable cities in the world, there has been a collective push in incorporating green design extensively to counter balance some of the serious obstacles facing this metropolitan area of more than 1.5 million residents.

On August 10, 2009, the second annual Clean Energy Summit was carried out in the Cox Pavilion at UNLV and included Senate Majority Leader Harry Reid, Former Vice President Al Gore, and Secretary Steven Chu of the U.S. Department of Energy, among other notable figures. This day-long, solution-oriented conference focused on the discussion of a policy agenda which would create new jobs by stimulating the application of clean energy and energy-efficient technology, all while advancing U.S. energy independence. It was followed up with the two day Renewable Energy Symposium where more than 200 clean energy proponents came together to share ideas and create the future of the sustainable energy movement in Nevada. Alternate sources of power such as algae-based energy were among the primary topics of discussion and urgency was the most notable undercurrent of the speakers' messages, signaling that it is time for immediate action.

Particular pressure was focused on the utility giant NV Energy, which supplies all of Nevada and a significant portion of North-Eastern California with electricity. The state of Nevada has mandated the company meet certain clean energy improvements and standards. As of 2008, renewable power accounts for 9% of the total power supplied by NV Energy, and if the company is going to meet its 2012 requirement of having 15% of its energy come from renewable resources, much work is left to be done.

Currently, the greatest push for renewable energy in Nevada and at NV Energy Company is the solar power installation program, consisting of retrofitting existing homes with Photovoltaic panels. Although this is a reasonable start, the solar panels are still leaving the homes dependent on NV Energy at night and on cloudy days. The \$45,000 price tag is cut in half via \$13,500 in federal tax credit and a \$9,500 rebate; however this still adds up to \$22,000 in upfront costs for the potential home owner. The high cost is limiting the number of households able to shoulder such investments.

Environmental groups remain skeptical

of what they consider half-hearted attempts by NV Energy to increase renewable energy output. Currently there is no incentive for a household or business in Nevada to generate any more power than it can use on its own, since there is no option to sell the power back to NV Energy.

Fortunately, affordable and effective ways to reduce energy consumption do exist. NV Energy has a list of no-cost, low-cost, and reasonably priced suggestions, described in detail at www.nvenergy.com, and can reduce 10-25% on a monthly energy bill.

Outside of retrofitting an existing home to become more energy efficient, an increasing number of LEED Certified projects have begun incorporating the highest standards of residential green architecture and design. Villa Trieste is a single family community in Summerlin and offers an integrated roof solar power system and is the largest residential project in the US to be LEED Certified. These homes are energy and water efficient, including a cen-

ABOUT L.E.E.D.

Since its inception in 1998, Leaderhip in Energy and Environmental Design, or LEED, has developed the standard against which environmentally sustainable building construction and lesign can be measured consistently Today there are over 14,000 LEED Certified projects in over 30 countries including the United States.

The LEED rating system includes six najor areas: sustainable sites, water efficiency, energy and atmosphere, materials and resources, environmental quality, and innovation and design process. With up to 106 points possible, buildings are scored in each aforementioned category according to the amount of sustainable innovation used in the project. The total of these points culminates in the certification of the building as LEED Certified, LEED Silver, LEED Gold, and LEED Platnum, with Platinum status being the highest rating available. The Vegas valley boasts its own LEED Certified mega projects, as well as commercial buildings and single family homes. These projects are paving the way to significantly reducing the negative environmental impact of buildings and construction in the Las Vegas valley.

tralized battery system storing power for use during peak energy consumption hours. The goal is to reduce energy consumption by 65% compared to a conventional home.

Las Vegas is also home to The Palazzo, the largest building in the world to have achieved LEED Silver certification. The Palazzo comes equipped with a solar powered pool heating system which pours over excess hot water into the hotel's hot water system and saves enough power to light a 100 watt light bulb for 12,100 years. While the building's efficient water fixtures use 37% less water than standard buildings, the innovative irrigation design saves an additional 75%. In addition, 70% of the demolition materials from the Sands building complex were saved from going to the landfill and 95% of the structural steel used in constructing The Palazzo was recycled.

Naturally, the "best in Vegas" reputation that The Palazzo achieved with its green design won't hold for very long. Gaming giant MGM Mirage is less than 2 months away from opening its CityCenter property, a 16 million square foot urban complex located next to the world famous Bellagio. The immense CityCenter project is an \$11 billion dollar feat of green engineering. The commendable sustainable design efforts of this project alone will eliminate approximately 48,000 tons of green house gases from being released into the atmosphere annually. Additionally, more than 80% of the construction waste will be re-used and recycled over the lifetime of the construction. CityCenter has gone to great lengths to increase the quality of the environment for its employees, providing a special air system to keep the smoke from reaching the dealers while gamblers smoke at the tables. These unprecedented efforts are garnering recognition locally and worldwide.

Although some would have guessed that green design would have been left behind in the wake of the down turn in the economy, it seems that no such fate befalls the growing billion dollar industry. As construction companies, sub contractors and artisans in Nevada become more educated in the process of ecofriendly design, LEED Certified building construction and design is continually inching closer to standard construction costs and beginning to yield greater future savings.





Holiday Eating

Don't Overdo It

read pudding. Pumpkin pie. Turkey and stuffing. Honey-glazed ham. Casseroles loaded with cheese...

The traditional artery-clogging foods of the holiday season made more sense if you lived on a farm a mere century ago. A nice fat tire around your belly kept you warm and happy throughout the lean days of winter, and you can bet that no pilgrim ever fretted about being a size two. The main task of winter was simply to get through it alive, and lard in the pie crust had meaning: pack on enough calories and you'd make it to see spring. Nowadays it doesn't make much sense to load up on the extra cornbread dressing – except that it's *delicious*. And really, how many times a year do we actually get to eat cornbread dressing? What are a few extra pounds going to do anyway?

It's as easy to rationalize festivity-inspired gluttony as it is to get an extra helping of mashed potatoes, but according to WebMD.com, most Americans gain an average of two holiday pounds they never end up losing. So if you are thirty years old and scratching your head at how skinny you looked at age twenty, multiply two pounds by ten years of Thanksgivings and you'll have your answer.

This isn't to suggest that we should ban pumpkin pie from the holiday table. Depriving ourselves of those irresistible holiday foods would be masochistic, if not downright impossible. Even someone with a will of iron will crack around a plate of snickerdoodle cookies. But avoiding holiday weight gain is not a hopeless cause – there are plenty of easy and economical strategies to maintain your weight during the holidays.

Slow down

The pleasure of eating is not in quantity, but in our ability to savor.

If you've ever been to Europe, you'll notice that the long wait for service isn't just because French waiters are surly but because they actually expect you to chew your food before you swallow it. In France, the gastronomic capital of the Western world, the average dinner may take several hours. Back in the states we feel lucky if we manage to eat at a kitchen table and not in a car. If your idea of "savoring" is wolfing down a burger while stopped at a traffic light, try chewing your food at least ten times before swallowing. Taking your time to eat will allow you to realize when you are full. You'll feel less groggy and you won't have to loosen your belt buckle a notch. And if there's any prime occasion to savor a food, it's with that perfectly roasted, once-a-year turducken.

Savor smaller portions

If you are attending a traditional Thanksgiving meal with a traditional caloriepacked smorgasbord, help yourself to a small portion of each dish. "Small" does not mean Applebee's sized, but a few decadent and slowly-enjoyed spoonfuls.

If you are still hungry for more, look for the lean meats and the vegetables. Have another serving of the green beans and white turkey meat and less of the creamed corn.

One more thing: lay off the booze. Alcohol is packed with calories and it's rarely as tasty as dessert.

Host a healthy potluck

Hosting a traditional Thanksgiving meal can make a substantial dent in your grocery budget. Let your friends and family know you are hosting a healthy, potluck-style Thanksgiving. It will allow everyone the opportunity to contribute a favorite dish without putting the financial burden on a single person. More than likely you'll savor something new and out of your usual cooking repertoire.

If your friends and family think that a "healthy Thanksgiving" is an oxymoron, gently share your vision of what that might look like.

Substitute ingredients

You can still honor your great-grandmother's recipes and stay healthy by substituting ingredients.

For instance, replace white bread and flour with whole grains. Whole grains contain more fiber and are gradually absorbed in your system, thus avoiding a spike in blood sugar levels and leaving us more satisfied for a longer period of time.

Consider using olive oil instead of butter, or try heart-healthy brands like SmartBalance. Neither contain the saturated fat of butter or the partially hydrogenated oil of margarine (both are terrible for you).

Use fresh vegetables and fruits instead of canned ones. They provide many more essential vitamins and minerals, and actually taste better than processed canned foods. A bowl of freshly made cranberry sauce is far more appetizing than the cylindrical, gelatinous cranberry blob that comes from a can. You can save a good deal of money on produce by sifting through the coupons that stuff your mailbox. Stores like LaBonita and Sunflower offer specials on

fresh produce that can seem insubstantial, but add up significantly.

In addition to honoring traditional dishes like turkey and stuffing, make sure to offer plenty of vegetables. Try including winter greens such as kale and chard, or astonish everyone with a delicious beet salad with goat cheese (it's shockingly good).

Desserts like a crustless pumpkin pie have a mousse-like decadence but cut out fat by omitting the crust.

If you are still hard-pressed for healthy Thanksgiving recipes, look around the Internet – there are dozens of helpful websites like allrecipes.com and foodnetwork.com which offer creative and healthy dishes.

Stay active

It's too easy to slip into a food coma after a heavy meal, but trade the television for a walk, before and after dinner. Exercising after meals helps suppress the appetite and can help ease the grogginess and bellyaching that often follows a large dinner.

Try to get your family involved in the exercise. Watch the football game, then round everyone up for an actual, touchfootball game in the back yard (if your

family is in the midst of a food coma, small wagers and stabs at pride can motivate just about anyone). Tell your mother-in-law that you would love to catch up but your mouth works best when you're walking. Or, invite your nieces and nephews out into the backyard for a game of tag or monkey in the middle.

Lastly, if you happen to be traveling over the holidays and are dying to get back on a treadmill, check out local gyms for temporary guest memberships or weekly trial offers.

Eat healthy now

Getting into the habit of eating well is a lot easier if you start before the holidays. Our bodies become addicted to simple carbohydrates and sugars and cutting out junk food now will help lessen the cravings that make you reach for a second helping.

At work, steer clear of the snack machine and bring your own healthy snacks to munch on. It's much easier to stay away from the cookies and candy in the lounge if there's something tasty awaiting you at your desk.







n December, the world will be introduced to CityCenter.






The Axe Murderer Comes to Vegas

From my personal experience I can say Mr. Silva is unquestionably one of the most sincere, humble, and gifted people I've met since moving to Vegas from Washington State a few years ago. Wanderlei Silva was born July 3, 1976 and is a Brazilian mixed martial arts fighter who trained under Rudimar Fedrigo at the Chute Boxe Academy in Curitiba, Brazil. Silva was branded "The Axe Murderer" for his fearless assaults in the cage ring; a mass majority of his fights have ended either by knock out or by referee stoppage due to his intense striking ability.

Silva has faced an array of Pride and Ultimate Fighting Championship fighters including Carl Malenko, Mirko "CroCop" Filipovic, Gilbert Yvel, Quinton "Rampage" Jackson, Pride Fighting champion Sakuraba, Guy Mezger, Dan Henderson and many other formidable opponents.

fighters or even a spectator sitting on the benches at gym.


There are some huge differences that set Wand Fight Team apart from other Las Vegas training facilities.

Ditching Depression During December

n a perfect world, everyone would be happy and optimistic throughout the holidays, but oftentimes winter sentiments are the exact opposite - that is, pessimistic and sad. An unrealistic expectation to be joyous can be the underlying cause for unwelcome feelings of bitterness and can lead to a serious case of the "Bah Humbugs". These holiday blues are common, especially when it seems like everyone else is celebrating and enjoying themselves, and they can easily become the catalyst for a melancholy holiday season.

There are many different causes which can contribute to this negative mental state.

Financial limitations, commercialism, striving for perfection, memories of prior holidays, family conflict, and remembering people you've lost through death, divorce

or separation - all of these events can serve to increase stress and fatigue.

'Tis the Season to be Jolly

Whether we participate fully or not, the holidays seem to suck the energy out of all of us. With all the parties to attend, errands to run, and family and business obligations on the agenda it is no wonder so many people are left feeling exhausted and drained.

Here are some practical ways to keep your battery from petering out.

Exercise - Fight fire with fire and combat energy loss with energy input. Hit the gym (preferably with a buddy) to fortify your metabolism, or take a yoga class to stretch away tension and mellow out. pumping. Whatever you decide, devote at least an hour of your time daily to these activities and it will pay off in spades.

Sound Nutrition - If you stuff your frustrated face with junk food you'll just induce lethargy, which is the opposite of what you're striving for. Below are some ideas to accomplish this goal:

- 1) Agree to exchange handmade items with the adults on your list.
- 2) Donate to a charity in a friend's name.

- 4) After all gifts have been unwrapped, plan to do something together. Bring the whole family to a sporting event, spend an afternoon at your local park or go see a movie, play, or concert.



An "Opportunity" to Give Back Local Charity Still Going Strong

hile doing the research for this article, pride was the word that kept coming to mind. Pride in the voice of Holly Spoor, Resource Development Director for Opportunity Village, as she talked about her work. Pride displayed in the stories of Opportunity Village's clients, who found opportunities to shine in ways they and their families never dreamed possible. Pride and a feeling of accomplishment gained by volunteers, supporters, and contributors to Opportunity Village and its programs.

Opportunity Village is a well-known name in Las Vegas. Begun in 1954 by a small group of families seeking to improve the lives of their intellectually-disabled family members, today it serves

more than 800 people daily, 3000 people annually. Opportunity Village offers vocational training, community job placement, social opportunities, and group advocacy to its clients. Their clients, in turn, gain a sense of accomplishment, a social network, and pride in themselves. Says Spoor, "It's so good for the whole family. It gives the parents a chance to go to work. It gives their disabled son or daughter a chance to learn skills and socialize. They then all have something to talk about at the dinner table."

There are 3 employment training center campuses and one thrift store operated by Opportunity Village in Southern Nevada. Here, hundreds of disabled adults are trained under supervision and placed in local community jobs where it is thought they would best succeed.

Opportunity Village contracts with local and national businesses for jobs such as light assembly work, complex electrical

and mechanical assembly, document shredding, and shrink wrapping. It trains some clients to hold jobs in the community. Opportunity Village saves money through competitive pricing for its services, and helps employ people who would otherwise be unemployable.

Some of Las Vegas' most popular events are hosted by Opportunity Village, including the annual Magical Forest. From the Saturday before Thanksgiving through January 2nd, the Magical Forest gives Las Vegans a place to experience the magic of Christmas. They even host a special New Year's Eve celebration. These events have become an annual tradition for many.

Now in its 18th season, the Magical

Forest was first begun in 1992 as a thankyou to the community. Spoor says the original consisted of only 3 decorated trees and a wishing well, yet people came. Now a huge display of hundreds of decorated and lit trees, a train ride, food, games, crafts, and visits with Santa, it is the single largest fundraiser for Opportunity Village.

Ninety-four percent of the Magical Forest is funded by donations. All of the proceeds go to Opportunity Village's PRIDE Program (People's Rights to Independence, Dignity, and Equality).

The Magical Forest is Spoor's baby, and she is full of excitement about this year's event. Close to 150,000 people attended last year. The forest changes every year, as different groups pay \$300 to sponsor and decorate the trees. Many new features are added yearly. New in 2008 included a newly-designed area for Photos with Santa and a Storytime Cabin, which Spoor says was very successful. New for 2009 will be Santa's Speedway, which will consist of pedal-car races for 3 to 7



Turning the Page - An inside look at the disappointment of a lost season, and the hope of something new for the 2009-10 UNLV Runnin' Rebels Men's **Basketball Team**

eading into last year's 2008-2009 men's basketball season, UNLV head coach Lon Kruger had nothing but excitement and expectation flowing through his veins. And why not? He was returning arguably the best senior threesome in the Mountain West Conference in Wink Adams, Joe Darger and Rene Rougeau.

This trio already had two MWC tourney titles under their collective belts along with two exciting runs through the NCAA Tournament, once making it to the Sweet 16, the other to the Second Round. The 2008-09 Rebels were built for a deep March Madness run.

That dream ended with a woodshed-type whipping at the hands of San Diego State on their home floor at the Thomas and Mack Center, 71-57. Three years of hard work and anticipation ended with team disfunction, selfish play, and, most importantly, the unfulfilled dreams of a city aching to see their beloved college

basketball team return to it's rightful place among the NCAA elite.

So what of the new season?

Gone are the familiar faces of Adams, Rougeau, and Darger. In are new faces such as Kentucky transfer guard Derrick Jasper. Promising point guard Oscar Bellfield, who started out with a bang last season but quickly fizzled once conference play began, will return with another year of experience under his belt. Tre'Von Willis, the Memphis transfer who had so many clutch performances down the stretch for the Rebels, assumes the leadership role for Lon Kruger's Rebels.

An exciting and competitive schedule with a hint of revenge and attitude lie in wait for this program. The team is hungry, and rightfully so -UNLV was picked by the media to finish a measly third place in the Mountain West this season.

Here is a closer look at some of the highlights that are waiting for the latest incarnation of the UNLV Runnin' Rebels basketball team.

Examining the Runnin' Rebels roster, firepower and experience should play a key factor throughout the season. Forward Matt Shaw, who was injured last season, returns to inject his

energy and enthusiasm to a young squad that should have no problem keeping up with just about anybody in the Mountain

The Rebels will also finally be able to man up under the boards. Sophomore center Brice Mossama at 6'10" as well as freshman Carlos Lopez, 6'11", will provide a presence in the paint that UNLV has not had in years (although it is unknown as of this printing whether or not Lopez will redshirt for 2009-10).

To go along with the explosive offensive skills of Willis and Jasper, three-point sniper Kendall Wallace returns to provide immediate energy and scoring off of Coach Kruger's bench. Darris Santee will continue his solid bench play as well.

The Rebels' pre-season schedule shapes up to be both exciting and competitive when in-state rival Nevada-Reno enters the Thomas and Mack Center on November 18th. The UNLV/UNR rivalry is intense and the game will no doubt set the tone for the entire season for the Rebels.

The long-awaited rematch between the Rebels and the Louisville Cardinals takes place on November 28th and will be the first true test of the team's mettle.

Last season, the Rebels entered Liberty Hall and shocked the college basketball world on national television by upsetting Louisville 56-55, stealing one from the nationally ranked team without the services of injured senior 2-guard Wink Adams. Louisville head coach Rick Pittino was so upset at having watched his prized Cardinals get knocked off that he refused to shake hands with Rebels' Coach Kruger at the conclusion of the game. UNLV basketball fans have a long memory and will be sure to let Coach Pittino know how they feel when he returns this season.

On December 2nd the long-time Pac-10 power Arizona Wildcats also return to Vegas looking for revenge, as the Rebels blew the doors off of the once mighty Wildcats last season.

Prior to Mountain West Conference play beginning, the Rebels travel to the big island of Hawaii to participate in the Diamond Head Classic Basketball Tournament, starting December 22nd and finishing up on Christmas day.

UNLV opens the tourney against Southern Methodist, with their remaining opponents to be determined as the exhibition tournament progresses.

The Rebel season doesn't get any easier upon their return from Hawaii as the 2009-10 Mountain West Conference schedule opens up. January 6th in Provo pairs the Rebels versus long-time conference rival and perennial contender Brigham Young, who are picked to win the Mountain West Conference this season. Once the Rebels finish with the Cougars in Utah, they get to travel to Albuquerque, New Mexico to face the Lobos in "The Pit", arguably one of the toughest arenas in all of college sports to compete in.

If the Rebels stumble out of the gate they could begin conference play at a dismal 0-2, which is never a great sign given the depth and talent of the Mountain West Conference year in and year out.


Once the Rebels return home, they get an immediate grudge match with the team that ended their season last year, San Diego State, who once again should be competitive with head coach Steve Fischer getting the most out of his Aztecs every single year.

The difference Coach Kruger hopes to see between the upcoming conference schedule and last year's season of disappointment is consistency. The Rebels have to win the games they are supposed to win-even the tough ones on the road against conference foes Wyoming and Texas Christian.

During the 2008-09 season the Rebels found ways to lose instead of digging a little deeper and using their superior athleticism and experience to garner the tough victories. In-fighting and inconsistent play helped the Rebels lose the faith and admiration of a community after two short seasons before getting Las Vegas excited about men's basketball again.

Without a deep roster of tournament experience to fall back upon, the new Rebel squad will have to use their god-given basketball skills, out-hustle their opponents, and return to the suffocating pressure defense that has become an annual trademark and necessity for the success of a Kruger-coached team.

And perhaps the celebration of the 20th anniversary of UNLV's sole NCAA Championship will rub off on the current Rebels throughout the 2009-10 season and give them the extra drive they need to live up to expectations and finish strong.
